The material in this issue of the Bengalla Mine Community Consultative Committee (Committee) newsletter has been selected by the CCC representatives.

The Committee is comprised of community representatives and representatives from Bengalla Mine including the General Manager. This newsletter aims to inform interested community members on matters discussed during CCC meetings.

Chair of the Bengalla CCC– Malcolm Ogg

Bengalla currently have a position available on the Committee, and so it is an opportunity to get to know Malcolm Ogg, the Chair of the Committee and his involvement in the local community.

Malcolm and his family have lived in Muswellbrook for almost 40 years, working as a TAFE teacher for twenty years. Malcolm was elected to Muswellbrook Shire Council in 1999, and in 2004 and 2014 was elected as Deputy Mayor.

Malcolm explains that according to Council, at the time, businesses and industries were referred to as Corporate Citizens, and because of their size and importance to the community it is critical that operational impact on the area is minimised.

Malcolm has been a part of the Committee since 2009, and he says that it is reassuring to the community that when a question is asked relating to a mine activity, the issue is dealt with in a timely manner and the meetings are very informative. Over time the meetings give members a relatively full understanding of Bengalla's operation.

The Community Consultative Committee is an advisory committee that provides a forum for community representatives, stakeholder groups and Muswellbrook Shire Council to engage with BMC regarding the operation of Bengalla.

School to Careers Pathways

Being able to actively participate in the School to Careers Pathways and partner with local schools is an important part of Bengalla's community engagement. This encompasses School Careers Days, which focuss on employing local students in our annual apprenticeship intake, offering annual Undergraduate scholarships and Engineering Scholarships (which entails 10 weeks of vacation work per year), work experience programs, work placement programs for students studying a TAFE course, and our partnership with the Polly Farmer Foundation.

We are always striving to have effective linkages through school to work initiatives that highlight pathways for youth in our local area. In August we welcomed 2 local Muswellbrook High School students to complete their 35 hours of work placement, a compulsory component of their vocational studies. The students completed work placement in a variety of areas within the business such as infrastructure and mobile maintenance.

This year the work experience placements for Year 10, have been postponed due to COVIC 19 however we are hoping to be able to host 10 students later this year. This will involve students having the opportunity to experience mining careers in a wide variety of areas at Bengalla so they can consider their career choices.



Computer Donations

Over the past 9 months Bengalla's Jonathan Walsh, IT support officer, has been working behind the scenes to refurbish site computers and put together computer packages so they are suitable for donation to groups and organisations in the community.

Jonathan has been working with a number of sporting clubs, community groups, the Rural Fire Service, not for profit organisations, schools and volunteer groups to donate computers that will be used

for things such as training. These computers have gone to groups in Muswellbrook, Denman, Merriwa and Scone. The latest batch of 15 computers will find a home in a school in Muswellbrook.
