7. REPORTS FROM CCC COMMUNITY REPRESENTATIVES

Report from [LB]:

- From the Wybong/Castle rock area how quickly the mine is progressing west. It is easy to see into the mine area. People/travellers are parking in the ditch and walking across with cameras. [CH] Mount Pleasant and Bengalla have had external drones flying over the mine area. [HF] Visual bund- getting soil samples and looking at planting trees along this area.
- How long before Bengalla Link Road will be completed? [GM] Completed by Friday is the plan.

Report from [TF]:

• Council elections are coming up soon. There are only 3-4 Council meetings remain for the current elected council and then will go to caretaker mode. Elections are in September.

Report from [DD]:

• On Monday Blackroo opened our Blackroo Community Haven. Blackroo have received a grant to rent the old Muswellbrook Fire Station. Blackroo now have their own space, they plan to expand the programs and they opened on Monday. Blackroo have done 4 pickups of furniture since Monday. Blackroo also do clothing and everything is free and assist approximately 5 families per week. With our own space we are better able to support families. We have a BBQ trailer and a catering trailer we

can run barista training. We also now have a furniture trailer with a ramp. Clothing bins are at the front. Blackroo are working in with other community organisations for donations. There will be an area for disability services to do art, craft especially for people utilising NDIS. The centre will also be able to work and assist with washing, folding and sorting, shredding etc and the money will go back into their programs.

- Wanaruah- the Development Application was approved and are up to construction certificate. Hoping in 3 months to be breaking soil to build the centre.
- De-Anne will run again for Council.

8. BENGALLA OPERATION UPDATE

[GM] 22-week plan shown. Rain has impacted the mining operation. Stockpiles are full and rail has been impacted. Several low-level recordable incidents/strains have been recorded and significant incidents have been dropping. [TF] The topsoil stripping, are you able to take that straight onto the rehab? [HF] No. The topsoil we stockpile, and the sub soil is in a good location. Ideally if we can place directly onto rehab we do. We are progressing closer to Bengalla Link Road and will need to work on a new western diversion levee.

9. APPLICATIONS AND APPROVALS

Bengalla is currently preparing a modification to change the consent in which we operate under. We have a recycled water agreement with Muswellbrook Shire Council. We are required to amend our licences to enable us to take this water. We have a scoping letter which has been submitted to the Department of Planning approximately a week ago. We hope to be lodging by end of May or beginning June at this stage. Map of the plan of the pipeline route shared with the CCC. The water will go to our dam precinct. We are also looking at the feasibility of installing a potable water pipeline at the same time for current and future land use. The modification will go to public exhibition and can be discussed further at the August meeting. This is in support of water being delivered to the Sandy Hollow community. The additional water is helpful for us for the process of adding flocculant in the coal handling preparation plant.

Exploration Lease

Site visit to the exploration drilling. Approximately 40 holes to be drilled. BMC current approval takes us to 2039 however we expect to meet this around 2036 timeframe. The exploration drilling is to look at resources beyond this.

AL19

New Hope Group has acquired the AL19 lease. There are some landholder interactions currently occurring. EL9431- which was where the site visit was to today, and then there is a gap area beyond that. There is a meeting shortly with Minister Houssos to discuss this. Malabar – New Hope Group has increased their shareholding to just under 20% with a view that there is a good long-term future. Coal caps finish in June 2024 and royalties increase from 8.2% to 10.8% so this will apply to our contracts with Eraring. [TF] what are the allowable activities in an authority? Are you allowed to explore? [CH] With AL19 there is a

list of commitments made from a New Hope Group perspective around the work that will be done over a 3-year period of time. Some of that includes an analysis of the information. In the area on the western boundary of EL9431 our intention is to secure an ability to explore that.

There are a number of landholders that fall within our zone of acquisition, and we are starting to engage with them as we move forward. There is a connection to land which we acknowledge and respect. We are engaging early to give people time. [LB] Why do you need to redrill on some properties? Is it because technology is better? [CH] It is probably more about accumulating more knowledge. Getting more information before we make a decision to and getting a better understanding of the resource. Are there faults? Underground? What is the quality of the coal? It is about trying to improve our knowledge of the resource which leads to detailed mine planning. Any drilling that needs to there needs to be a lot of engagement with landowners. [TF] Could a map be provided showing the private landowners in the area? [CH] Yes, we can. We have this information available.

Bengalla Link Road.

We have just completed resurfacing on Bengalla Link Road and now just waiting online marking which is planned for Friday. This will then mean this section is complete.

10. LAND MANAGEMENT

[HF] Rehabilitation preparation involves sewing some cover crop to improve the soil quality.

Pest management control. Wild dog baiting and pig trapping program. In 2023 63 pigs trapped and culled on the offset properties and our buffer land. There have been very few wild dog sitings. Numbers seem to be stagnant. First round of baiting commenced end of April. There are more foxes than dogs taking the baits.

Weed management is reported every year in our Annual Review report. We are mostly targeting noxious weeds- African box thorn, St Johns Wart, prickly pear and lantana. These are also our target for this year.

11. ENVIRONMENTAL MONITORING RESULTS

Environmental monitoring review for February, March and April 2024 (the Reporting Period).

- Air Quality:
 - Criterion 24 Hour PM10. During the Reporting Period Bengalla was compliant with the 24-hour PM10 air quality criterion. There were two (2) all-source criterion exceedances recorded by the monitoring network. Following investigation, the results were revised for Bengalla only contribution to below the 24 hour criterion.

Operational downtime- Since the last meeting in February the amount of downtime in relation to dust. The cumulative amount of downtime from February to April for trucks and excavators. This time is just for dust. Summary of total down time for each month shared with the CCC.

• Noise Management:

• For the Reporting Period Bengalla was compliant with the noise criteria. There were 2 exceedances in the noise monitoring however noise criteria do not apply due to invalid weather conditions (inversion) as defined in the mines development consent SSD-5170.

• Blast Monitoring:

• For the Reporting Period Bengalla was compliant with the blast criteria.

• Water Usage:

- Bengalla has extracted 1798ML from the Hunter River from 1 July 2023 to 30 April 2024. Rainfall was below the long-term average for February and March, and above the long-term average for April during the reporting period.
- Bengalla Mine did not discharge to the Hunter River during the reporting period.

• Complaints:

- Since the last meeting, 7 complaints have been received 2 blast vibration, 3 air quality, and 1 for noise.
- Environmental incidents: 0.
