TRFF PLANTING

The Acland Management Plan outlines a strategy for the improvement of the Acland town area through the planting of native vegetation in open areas, to create a pleasant 'open parkland'.

The aim of this planting is to increase the amenity and visual appeal of the township area, as well as providing habitat for local fauna species.

This planting consists entirely of native plants, including a number of rainforest and koala habitat species.

Species include bottle trees (both broad leaf and narrow leaf varieties), Forest Red Gum, Blue Gum and Crow's Ash.

Due to the current dry conditions throughout the local area, this planting has been kept alive by periodic watering and maintenance, including fertilising and weeding.

A relatively high survival rate exceeding 85% has been achieved, and most plants are building up strong root systems.
