NEW HOPE GROUP IS PROMOTING FUTURE VOCATION OPPORTUNITIES FOR LOCAL OAKEY STUDENTS BY BRINGING THE QUEENSLAND MINERALS AND ENERGY ACADEMY (OMEA) TO OAKEY STATE HIGH SCHOOL.

The New Hope funded industry skills and training program has already delivered two workshops to students this year.

New Acland Environmental Officer Brooke Topp and Mining Engineer Kylie Smith visited students to share their knowledge on water management and physics.

A QMEA Careers Pathway Day was also attended by New Acland's Maintenance Advisor Bruce Collins who spoke with students hoping to pursue trade apprenticeships after graduation.

New Acland Mine General Manager David Vink said supporting the education of local students was an important step in helping the Oakey community to build a strong future.

"Supporting education and skills development in the region was identified as one of six priority areas during consultation with locals in the recent Community Needs and Resources research we conducted," David said.

"It's important to invest in our local kids and provide them with the skills and support to get them into rewarding and stable careers.

"The QMEA program encourages students to study subjects in science, technology, engineering and maths to help them break into careers like mechanics, engineering and environmental science.

"These core subjects play an important role in many of our local industries like mining, agriculture, aviation, construction and meat processing.

"The QMEA program demonstrates to young people that there are great career opportunities in the Oakey region and we hope that by supporting the program we can help retain young people locally."

KEY FACTS ON NEW ACLAND STAGE 3 PROJECT

- New Acland Mine currently has around 275 employees and 500 contractors
- New Acland Mine currently produces around 4.5–5 million tonnes per annum
- The Stage 3 application for New Acland Mine would allow it to produce up to 7.5 million tonnes per annum
- Stage 3 will boost employment to around 435 employees at peak production and employ around an additional 260 workers during construction
- A New Acland Mine closure will be felt throughout the local community and QLD – mine workers, rail workers, Port workers, increased energy costs for Qld businesses

NEW ACLAND MINE AND THE QUEENSLAND ECONOMY

STAGE 3 WILL CONTRIBUTE \$300 MILLION PER YEAR TO THE SOUTH-EAST QUEENSLAND ECONOMY

- \$110 million per year to
 Darling Downs local businesses
 and economy
- Including \$11 million per year to Toowoomba Regional Council for council rates, other local government charges and recycled waste water
- \$100 million per year to Aurizon and QLD Rail which keeps the West Moreton Rail System viable for other industries, including agriculture
- \$11 million per year for port operations

ACLAND PASTORAL COMPANY

- Acland Pastoral runs approx.
 3000 head of cattle, including
 2000 breeding cows
- Acland Pastoral uses recycled water from Toowoomba for irrigation and watering cattle
- Acland Pastoral is currently cropping around 720ha of land next door to New Acland Mine
- A cattle grazing trial, now in its fifth year, shows cattle on rehabilitated mined land often outperform cattle on unmined land
- Acland Pastoral operates on approximately 10,000ha of land around New Acland mine, including 480ha of rehabilitated mined land
